# Buckden Parish Council News



#### **Seasonal Greetings**

All councillors and staff at Buckden Parish Council would like to wish you all a very, merry Christmas and a happy and healthy 2017.

We would also like to thank members of Buckden4Business and the churches who have worked so hard to make the Christmas Lights Switching On such a memorable occasion – thank you to all.

#### **Proposed Lucks Lane Development**

As most of our residents will know, there has been an outline planning application made to build 180 houses in the field behind The Osiers and Springfield Close, with access from Lucks Lane. This application has been refused by Huntingdonshire District Council, with a recommendation for refusal being made by Buckden Parish Council.

We have recently learnt that this decision will be challenged at an appeal conducted by the Planning Inspectorate. Your Parish Council is now considering what steps that we can take and we will keep you informed of progress on this matter.

#### **Defibrillators**

The Parish Council, in conjunction with the Doctors' Surgery, is now in the process of purchasing two defibrillators. We are very pleased that the Village Hall Trust are happy to have one of the defibrillators installed on the outer wall of the village hall, next to the main entrance. We feel that this is a central position, where it can be easily accessed by all the sporting clubs and will be clearly visible at night-time, if required.

We hope that the other defibrillator can be located in the old telephone box on the High St, near the Church St corner. However, there is a little red tape that we need to go through before this plan is finalised.

#### Δ14

At the November Parish Council meeting, we received an update from the A14 Integrated Delivery Team. We were told that, currently, county archaeologists are examining the site, prior to it being released for construction. Additionally, environmental work is being carried out to protect various species of wild life. We will see the compound on the way to Brampton growing significantly over the next few weeks but no road construction will begin until the spring.

The whole project is in 6 phases. The upgrade of the A1 north of the Brampton Hut will be the first part of the work to be completed, with the last being the work to remove the Huntingdon viaduct and re-route the roads in the area of Huntingdon station. #### FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

As winter approaches the county council is getting ready for gritting icy roads. 26 new gritters are set to arrive at the county council's 4 highway depots on October 26<sup>th</sup>. The council has a seven year contract with ECON who supply the council with new gritters every year from November through to April each year. This year the routes the gritters will travel along have been revised to reflect the challenging financial pressures that face the council. The gritting routes have been designed to make sure all strategic routes have been gritted as well as all major roads such as to hospitals and schools. (Roads such as A14, M11, A47, A1 and A428 are gritted by Highways England) The new routes cover over 1,000 miles of the county's roads and can be viewed at <a href="https://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/wintergritting">www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/wintergritting</a>. Plan your route to work in winter conditions based on the routes that are gritted, In this area the B1040 and B1046 will be gritted. Cambridgeshire sees differing temperatures and weather conditions across the county which is why this year the county has been divided into 3 sections, North/East, South/West and City. Gritting will then be tailored to meet the local needs and based on the conditions in these 3 areas rather than on the county as a whole. There is also an army of more than 70 local volunteers who help treat their local area when temperatures drop to freezing and below. If you would like to volunteer in your local community to help treat local areas please contact me.

#### FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

#### Take-over of Hinchingbrooke Health Care by Peterborough and Stamford Hospitals.

I am a member of the HDC Scrutiny Panel which has examined the plans for the proposed 'merger' at meetings that have been open to the public. The Scrutiny Panel has expressed concerns about the balance of the proposed governance of the new Trust- it fears that decisions taken by the new Trust could favour areas of Peterborough City Council, Stamford and the southern area of South Kesteven District Council at the expense of Huntingdonshire. It was also worried by the apparent lack of a Plan B and the failure to explain what other options had been considered, the increase in the number of redundancies and their likely effect on Huntingdon residents and the future of the proposed Health Campus to be built behind the existing hospital.

#### **Devolution**

The full District Council will debate the proposed Devolution on Wednesday 16th November. By the time you read this you may have read or heard the decision through the local media. I will provide a short summary in next month's Roundabout.

#### Memories are made of this

We were told at the Village Remembrance Service that memory can be fickle and that sometimes it play tricks on us. The memory of this year's service in St Mary's Church when we remembered those who have sacrificed their lives so that we may enjoy the benefits of living in our lovely village will live with me for a long time. There are perhaps three major times of the year when the village coalesces as one; Remembrance Sunday, Christmas and Easter – well perhaps the Summer Festival should be included. Long may we retain our identity and our pleasant environment.
