A14

Many residents will have seen preparatory work for the new A14 in the fields on the left on the way to Brampton. This area will form two compounds and will house offices and equipment to be used in the construction. It will not, however, house any accommodation. Further work can also be seen in the fields alongside the A1 north of the Brampton interchange.

Over the next few years, we will see major changes in our local landscape as a consequence of the construction of the new A14. The Parish Council recommends that, if you are interested, you should attend one of the many public information exhibitions that are held locally to keep residents and business people informed. Dates can be found on the Highways England website. Additionally, the route of the new A14, together with all details of the plans for construction, can also be found on the website. We will also give dates of local exhibitions on this page as they come up.

All information on the A14 Scheme is available at the Highways England website at www.highways.gov.uk/A14C2H

The Highways England website and the public exhibitions are very informative and should answer most questions. However, if you have a major concern relating to the A14, please contact the Clerk. However, we would appreciate it if you would only contact him as a last resort.

The decision of the Local Government Boundary Commission is to change the boundaries for the county council division currently known as Buckden, Gransden and the Offords with effect from the county council elections on May 4th 2017. The new county council division encompassing Buckden will be known as the Brampton and Buckden division and will incorporate Buckden and Diddington, Southoe and the Offords and Brampton. Residents will decide on their new county councillor at the elections on May 4th 2017. At the same time on 4th May 2017 residents will also be electing a mayor for the newly combined authority for Peterborough and Cambridgeshire.

FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

A14 Residents will have noticed that work has started on the A14. We shall see increased developments north of Buckden and work on the River Ouse, railway, road viaduct is due to start next spring. I hope that you have all taken the opportunity to attend the public Information exhibitions held at The Offords and Brampton. If you missed these or the three other local exhibitions you may find it useful to go to one of the four remaining - full information can be found on the A14 website. The Parish Council and I have pressed the need to keep all construction traffic out of the village and you will have seen the signs barring such traffic on our approach roads. If you have any queries you will find it easiest to get up to date answers on the web site www.highways.gov.uk/ A14C2H or contact the project team on A14cambridgehuntingdon@highwaysengland.co.uk or by telephone 0300 1235000. If you are still unhappy please don't hesitate to contact me.

Future of A1 At the recent meeting of the A1 Safety Advisory WG, which represents Buckden, Diddington and Southoe, we pressed the Highways England representative for better speed control on the sections of the A1 approaching the roundabout from the north and the south. We are also suggesting that the access from the north end of the High Street onto the A1 could be improved. We are hoping that a clearer picture of proposed routes for the upgraded A1 may be available in the new year. Unfortunately it appears that we are unlikely to see any tangible improvements until at least 2025.

Speeding in the Village I share concerns about the speed of cars through the village and am very happy to hear that the Parish Council is trying to increase the number of volunteers for its Speed Watch team. If you would like to volunteer please contact the Parish Clerk.

Fireworks If you are planning to celebrate Guy Fawkes in your garden please remember to talk to your neighbours and consider the effect that bangs and flashes can have on dogs.

LUCKS LANE DEVELOPMENT – GLADMAN APPEALS – THE FIGHT GOES ON!

As expected, Gladman Developments have appealed the Hunts District Council's refusal to grant planning permission for the proposed development for 180 new houses off Lucks Lane. The appeal will be decided at an inquiry by The Planning Inspectorate at some time, probably in the next six to ten months.

Now the hard work starts. The Protect Buckden's Future group will, with your continued support, use its expertise to gather data and conduct further research in order to oppose the development at this final appeal stage.

We hope that you are still concerned about this development which will irreparably damage the future of this village, its population and its roads, as well as set a precedent for over development of all Huntingdonshire villages; please consider if you may be able to assist with funding and/or in person (e.g. surveys etc.) at some future time.

Farming for Wildlife

Farming for wildlife is the topic of the illustrated talk to be given to the Wildlife Trust, Huntingdonshire Local Group, on Wednesday 9th November 2016 at 7.30pm at Brampton Memorial Hall, Thrapston Road, Brampton.

Our presentation will be given by Nicholas Watts, who owns Vine House Farm in Lincolnshire. Vine House farm is a traditional arable farm in the Fens and has been passed down through the generations. Nicholas will tell us about the conservation measures he uses whilst farming in order to create and maintain a wide range of habitats and thereby encourage wildlife.

Nicholas grows seed specifically for bird food and supplies direct to the public, benefiting the Wildlife Trusts with donations from his profits. In 2013 Nicholas was the winner of the RSPB Nature of Farming award.

Letter to the Editor

I am writing to you having read the comments advanced by Julie Wisson in the latest edition of the Roundabout, regarding recent events involving Hinchingbrooke Hospital. I would like some space in order to provide another perspective, speaking as a member of the Hands Off Hinchingbrooke Group. To begin with what we are discussing is not a merger but an acquisition, with the Scrutiny Panel of the District Council arguing for clarity and transparency in language, and criticising the Hospital Board for their lack of care in not explaining that we are not talking about a merger of equals, but an acquisition or take over, which then raises concerns about the balance of influence and power. The Panel further detected a "democratic deficit", represented by 2 facts on the ground. Firstly, the lack of a clear programme for public engagement, which only recently has the Board sought to address, with the publication of the Full Business Case. Secondly, it was pointed out that there was a clear absence of local representation on the Hospital Board, with only one member of it currently living in our catchment area. Another concern voiced by the panel was the risk of attempting to do too much in too short a time.

It has to be remembered that mergers do not usually succeed in achieving their aims. The Kings Fund conducted an in depth study in 2015, examining 20 mergers, with them coming to the damning verdict that they normally fail, and do not finally solve the problems they set out to address. I note Jonathan Djanogly's recent comment that he agrees that mergers have generally been unsuccessful, and that it requires a leap of faith to think otherwise. We have also had the experience in Cambridgeshire of 2 previous failed experiments in health care, namely Circle and the Uniting Health Care Contract.

Let's return to the use of language and assurances we have received about services being retained at Hinchingbrooke. In the Full Business Case it states that "changes in the future as to how services at Hinchingbrooke are designed and delivered may happen as a result of other commissioning work." This implies to me that the Clinical Commissioning Group could decide on significant changes in the near future. I couple this observation with the ambiguous language used in the draft document as part of the Sustainability and Transformation Plan. Within it we read "we can <u>expect</u> maternity services will remain at Hinchingbrooke", and "we <u>expect</u> 24/7 urgent care services will remain at Hinchingbrooke." And moreover there is no explanation as to how the projected deficit of 250 million in 2020 in Cambridgeshire Health Care is to be resolved.

Finally, adding to my disquiet, I am aware of 2 Reports. NHS Providers, which speaks for the Chairs and Chief Executives of Health Trusts, have just issued a stark warning that the NHS has reached breaking point, with years of underfunding making it very likely that in the next few months decisions will have to be taken to either close or downgrade services throughout England. And the Guardian and 38 Degrees have conducted an investigation revealing that there are plans in process to close District General Hospitals and downgrade services all over England.

No one can have confidence about the future, with it being universally agreed that a financial black hole exists at the heart of the NHS, with recorded hospital deficits totalling 2.45 billion. No one can provide guarantees, in the current economic climate, as to where we will end up. Remember the government has already closed nearly 10,000 NHS beds and 16% of A and E wards.

Christians would no doubt say the former whilst many folk would probably say the latter matters most, but both are equally necessary and therefore both should be seen as equally important.

Knowing and finding God is very much a matter of faith. If we know all about God and understand all about His nature and character, then that would be knowledge and faith would no longer be necessary. God cannot be reduced to human description or a scientific formula; He is a Spiritual Being, unseen, yet can be experienced and reached, and it therefore requires faith to find and to know Him. Jesus Christ came to show us the way and to reveal what God is really like. It then becomes possible for us to live the life which God intended for us, for we then have His power and presence in our lives.

Which wing of an aeroplane is the most important? Both are equally necessary. In the same way, finding the Living God should impact and influence our lives and our relationships with others. Jesus Himself said "I have come to give you life and it is life to the very full" and that life lasts for eternity.



NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH (NHW) DANGERS OF USING MOBILE PHONE

Studies have shown that using a mobile phone whilst driving is so distracting that it's as dangerous as being over the drink drive limit. Studies have also shown that reaction times are 50 per cent slower if using a mobile phone whilst driving, and you are four times more likely to have a collision. Comparisons have been made to it impairing ability to drive to a similar degree as driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

Driving while using a mobile phone is considered one of the 'fatal four' driving offences, along with speeding, not wearing a seatbelt and drink or drug driving. The Government has recently announced plans to increase the penalties for driving whilst using a mobile phone. The decision comes following a number of high profile court cases where mobile phone use was deemed a factor in fatal collisions. In Cambridgeshire, in the last six months, 595 people were caught using their mobile phone whilst driving.




