As reported last month, Buckden Parish Council has received notice of a speculative outline planning application to build approximately 180 new homes adjacent to Buckden. It is proposed that the estate would be built in the fields behind The Osiers and Springfield Close, with the access in Lucks Lane just after the Springfield Close junction.

At the point of writing, over 60 households in Buckden and Stirtloe have taken the trouble to contact us with their views. The Parish Council is still very keen to hear residents' views on this proposed application. Unveiling of the commemorative paving stone for Captain John Green VC on 1st July 2016. We can feel very proud that Buckden was the birthplace of Captain Green, a member of the Royal Army Medical Corps, who was awarded a VC posthumously following his outstanding bravery on the first day of the Battle of the Somme in 1916. A commemorative paving stone for Captain Green will be unveiled on 1st July 2016, exactly one hundred years after it was awarded.

The Parish Council would like to invite all residents to attend the commemorative event. Medals may be worn. This will begin at 11 a.m. at the Green Memorial on the High St, opposite the pedestrian entrance to The Towers. We will then proceed to the war memorial in St Mary's churchyard, where the stone will be unveiled.

FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Local Government Boundary Commission review of Cambridgeshire County Council boundaries: Having spent time last year consulting on the county council division boundaries the Local Government Boundary Commission have given their final decision regarding the county division boundaries. There will be a reduction in councillors for the county council from 69 currently to 61. Buckden, Diddington, Southoe and Medloe, Offord Darcy and Offord Cluny will go into a division with Brampton forming the Brampton and Buckden division. These changes will come into effect at the council elections in May 2017.

20 is Plenty for Buckden: I was very pleased that the application for a 20mph speed limit surrounding the school was supported by Cambridgeshire County Council in the recent Local Highways Initiative grants meaning that the majority of the scheme will be financially delivered by the county council Highways department and the remainder of the funding will be raised by Buckden Parish Council. County council Highways officers will consult with the parish council and residents regarding the scheme.

FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

A14

We shall soon hear the final decision of the Secretary of State and I anticipate that work will start on the new A14 by the middle of the year. Probably the first effect on the village will be the large storage area and domestic site which will be sited between Buckden and Brampton. There will inevitably be fears about dust, noise and heavy traffic as construction work proceeds and I can assure residents that the Parish Council and I will do our best to ensure that any disruption is kept to a minimum.

OUSE VALLEY WAY AND OTHER RIGHTS OF WAY

We can be rightly proud of the Ouse Valley Way which runs through 14 parishes in Huntingdonshire and is part of one of the longest footpaths in England. There have been doubts about its upkeep but I can assure residents that the District Council has confirmed that it will maintain it until at least the end of the 16-17 financial year. In the meantime I am involved in compiling and agreeing a long term plan for its continued maintenance. Our footpaths and bridleways are an important asset for the village and I know that the Chairman of the Parish Council is writing elsewhere in this edition asking for a volunteer or volunteers to be the Village Footpath Coordinator. You don't have to be a member of the Parish Council, although it's an advantage. I urge any person who is a keen walker and wants to see our ROW maintained to consider volunteering for this role. From personal experience I know that it can be combined with the role of Tree Warden and become a very rewarding recreation-al activity, perhaps for a recently retired person.

COUNCIL TAX

We have now all received our Council Tax Bills and will have noted that the Parish, District and County Councils' amounts have not been increased. Personally I welcome the additional charge for Adult Social Care in the hope that the money raised will be used sensibly to improve the lot of some of our most vulnerable residents.

Buckden Local History Society

Alan Butler who has worked at the Cromwell Museum for 15 years gave an illuminating and entertaining overview of the history of the museum and life as a staff member. Clearly not one just to sit behind a desk, he has spent hours researching the records and documents held by the museum.

Originally part of a much larger building used as travellers' accommodation, it was reduced to its present size by the time Cromwell was at school there. He probably would not recognise it as by the mid–19th century it was subsiding badly. It was rescued thanks to the generosity of Dion Boucicault (himself a fascinating character) whose son died in the Abbots Ripton rail crash of 1876. The building was taken apart but rebuilt very differently.

The museum passed the half million visitor mark 2 or 3 years ago. People have come from all over the world to see it. Several women visitors had been at school there during the war, having been evacuated from London.

One visitor from America wanted to know if Mr Cromwell was in the habit of visiting. On being told he is no longer with us, she enquired if his children or grandchildren came by at all. Obviously Alan is a diplomat as well as a guide.

Thought for the month

The Lord has risen; let us rejoice. Alleluia, Alleluia

Easter is the most important feast in the Christian calendar. We are celebrating the fact that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, rose from the dead and promises resurrection to all who believe in him. To prepare for this celebration we have just been through the season of Lent in which we are encouraged to put our lives straight with God.

This is also the theme of the Jubilee Year of Mercy as proclaimed by Pope Francis for the whole Catholic Church throughout the world. This Year of Mercy runs from the 8th December 2015 to 20th November 2016 (the end of the liturgical year).

In the early history of God's people in Israel a Jubilee Year was a time of special honour of God, shown by a change in the way of life. Every seven years fields would be left fallow, for a year of rest, (a Sabbath year), but every fifty years there was a year of Jubilee. In this very special year any land that had been taken in pledge would be returned to the original owners. Sins were remitted. Universal pardon was granted. Prisoners were released. Slaves were freed. All debts were forgiven. God's mercy was celebrated. (Lev. 25: 8 – 13). In medieval times, Pope Boniface VIII introduced Church Holy Years every 50 or 25 years. These renew the impetus for 'conversion of heart', which the more ancient Jubilee year always had as its goal.

During this Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy Pope Francis encourages Catholics to spend more time in prayer, use the Sacrament of Reconciliation to return to God, spend more time reading the Bible. One Gospel passage Pope Francis calls our attention to is Luke 4: 16 - 22. As Jesus starts his ministry in Galilee he proclaims the fulfilment of the prophet Isaiah's words: 'He has sent me to bring good tidings to the afflicted; to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim liberty to captives'.

NIGHTINGALES

Have you ever heard a nightingale sing? If not, have you ever wondered what all the fuss is about? Poets and writers go on and on about nightingales and it's always about the song and the mix of melancholy and joy that it arouses in us.

It's hardly worth describing the actual bird. You probably won't see one because they hide among the leaves, even when singing and, even when you do see one, there isn't much to write home about; it looks like a robin in a sepia photograph, or a small thrush without spots, which is exactly what it is.

So, it's all about the song. Nightingales arrive in the UK from West Africa



in the first half of April. The males come first and they sing their hearts out, day and night, to attract any passing female. It might be mid May before they have all settled down to nest. A male with a family will continue to sing at night, but less often in daytime while an unmated male just keeps on singing until it gets hungry. And what a song it is. It has the rich tone of a song thrush but, instead of repeating every phrase it keeps coming up with new ones. The most recognisable part of the song is an insistent seep-seep-seep on one note that starts very quietly then builds and builds until it explodes into a a whole song jammed into less than two seconds. There is also a lower pitched jug-jug-jug call and a rattle. It doesn't sound that great does it? That's because I just can't capture it in writing and that has been the challenge for writers and poets down the ages. The joy and wonder bit comes from the sheer virtuosity of the bird but there is also suspense. The song is composed of long and short phrases with silences in between. There is no better way to get your attention than by starting to say something and then pausing for effect and it works even better in a song. You never know how long the pause will be; just a beat, a whole bar or even a whole verse? Or has the bird gone off somewhere?

The melancholy component is interesting too. All musicians know that a sad song, such as dirge or even a blues number, has to be in a minor key. Imagine a Miles Davis solo played on a flute and you are getting close.

I hope that, by now, I've piqued your interest enough for you to ask, "Where can I go to hear a nightingale?" Most English nightingales (they don't occur in Wales or Scotland) are found in Kent and the South East. If you draw a line from the Bristol Channel to the Wash, that's roughly the northern limit for these summer birds. We live right on the north-west edge of their range in Europe, but we have a few good sites on our doorstep. Paxton Pits Nature Reserve holds 25 to 30 pairs in a good year and a visit in May has become an annual pilgrimage for bird-lovers from all over the UK. There are nightingales up at Grafham Water and at Castor Hanglands up beyond Peterborough.

As for timing, you can hear them day or night, but just before dawn is best or just after sunset. This is because these are the times of day when almost all of the males will be singing, and because most other birds won't be singing.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH (NHW)

Five common online scams - stay alert. 1 COMPUTER VIRUSES

Computer viruses (sometimes called malware) are programmes designed to break into your computer. Fraudsters often hide viruses in email attachments .The virus can take over your computer and give control to criminals. Always ensure your anti-virus software is up to date.

2 ONLINE SHOPPING

Be cautious when entering your credit card details and personal information on a shopping website. Ensure the company has a reputation for online security. 3 FAKE WEBSITES

Scammers can create fake websites which look like the official ones. Often they look very similar - only a few tiny details may be different. Scammers will try to direct people to their fake websites by email, hoping to gain personal login details. They also imitate or duplicate a service offered by government (passport renewal or new driving licence) for additional fees. If you are in doubt which website to use, go through GOVUK, the official website, to find what you need.

4 RELATIONSHIP SCAMS

Some people use social networks such as dating websites or chat rooms to scam people Once they've gained your trust they'll start asking you for money, often by telling you an emotional or hard luck story. 5 HEALTH SCAMS

Unrealistic claims may be made about medically related products such as miracle health cures. Fake online pharmacies may offer medicines cheaply. Check whether an online pharmacy is legitimate by clicking on the "Registered Pharmacy" logo on the website home page - this should lead to the General Pharmaceutical Council website.
