# Buckden Parish Council News...

#### Buckden Neighbourhood Plan

The Plan is now complete and available for you to view as part of a formal consultation process. This will begin on 25<sup>th</sup> November and conclude on 6<sup>th</sup> January. You can view the plan and provide feedback by going to the BPC web site, (see below). Paper copies are also available in the village hall office. This is an important document. It sets out what developers can and can't do in our village. Whilst we cannot stop the Silver Street development, which is included in the Huntingdonshire Local Plan, we have drafted policies, particularly about traffic, house type and design which the developers must comply with. When finalised it will also significantly increase the amount of money the village receives from developers. It is important we get your feedback. Once the consultation is complete the plan will be submitted for review by a planning inspector.

#### **Climate Change Mitigation**

We will be holding a workshop on 11<sup>th</sup> January titled 'What on Earth Can Buckden Do'. Please join us between 1 and 7pm in the village hall. See further information pn page 13.

#### Vandalism at the Village Hall Playing Fields

We are experiencing an increase in vandalism most recently of the playground equipment. This is very expensive to repair. BPC and the Village Hall Trust are running a quiz night on 6<sup>th</sup> December to raise funds for this. Please join us.

#### A14

The Southern Bypass from Brampton to Swavesey is due to open in December this year. Once the Bypass opens to traffic, the A14 will be closed from junction 24 at Godmanchester, to junction 23 at Spittals. This will enable major work to begin to demolish the viaduct in Huntingdon. This work will begin in February and will take approx. 18 months.

#### Lucks Lane

Several of you have raised concerns relating to the work in Lucks Lane. We meet monthly with the site manager and, so far, have had a positive response to most of the issues. Please continue to let us know of problems.

#### The A1 and The Roundabout

The BPC Chair met with our MP Jonathan Djanogoly in October to highlight your concerns about safety and congestion at the roundabout. He is due to meet with Highways England,



assuming he is re-elected, in January and will raise our various issues with them.

#### Silver Street and Mill Road developments

Both developments remain on hold. So far, the developers transport consultants have not identified a solution that resolves the additional traffic congestion created by the developments.

Highways England appear to have listened to our concerns about the safety of the previous proposal which created the potential for collision between A1 through-traffic and any stationary vehicles caught at traffic lights on the roundabout.

In order to make progress it has been agreed that a new more detailed computer model of the junction will be built over the next few months. Additional traffic data collection is currently on going. You may have noticed the cables across the High Street, Perry Road and Mill Road.

The Parish Council have submitted a further objection to the Mill Road development.

#### Mill Road

We are chasing Cambridgeshire County Council about progress with traffic calming measures on this dangerous stretch of road.

#### **New Councillor**

If required, the Council Planning Committee will meet on 10<sup>th</sup> December. Agendas for these meetings are posted on the Parish notice boards no later than the Saturday preceding the meeting.

**BEWARE AMAZON PRIME SCAM** 

Action Fraud is warning people about a new scam that charges individuals for an Amazon Prime subscription.

The organisation has received hundreds of reports of a scam where victims receive an automated phone call claiming they've been charged for an Amazon Prime subscription.

The phone call informs people their personal details have been fraudulently used to subscribe to Amazon Prime, however they can cancel the transaction by pressing 1 on their phone keypad.

When victims do this, they are automatically connected to criminals posing as Amazon customer service representatives who then remotely access their computer and steal their personal and financial details. ACTION FRAUD ADVICE

- Never install software as a result of a cold call
- Always guestion uninvited approaches in case it's a scam
- If in doubt contact a company directly using a known email address or phone number
- Feel confident to refuse unusual requests for personal or financial information.

#### FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

#### Confusing and difficult times ahead

November and December are normally the months when Cambridgeshire County Council committees try to work out how to provide services to the public for the following financial year (starting April 2020). This is always a difficult task as we have to juggle with several variables: the demand for services; grants for local government from central government; the decision by the Council on tax increases (if any).

This year, in addition to all those variables, we have a General Election in December and although the main focus of attention will be the Brexit dilemma, the outcome of the election will also affect many other aspects of public life – adult social care, care for young people, schools, NHS, housing etc. So, planning is even more difficult this year.

What we do know for sure is that demand for the services provided by the County Council is increasing owing to the impact of prolonged austerity on the most deprived in our community.

Alongside what we might call the 'macro-problems' which affect all communities across the country, we have the 'microproblems' – the everyday local issues which affect the quality of life and safety of local residents. These vary slightly from village to village, but usually include dangerously worn-out road markings and unfilled pot-holes, as well as what we might call the more 'cosmetic' shortcomings (slime-covered road signs, overgrown verges, damaged street names, unweeded public areas).

We would like to thank all of the children, tots to teenagers, who visited us at Halloween. Over 90 in all. Their costumes and make-up were fantastic and the smiles and greetings were heart-warming. They all thanked us for their treats. What a lovely evening!!

Another new and important dimension this year is the increasing public awareness of environmental issues and climate change. All the County Council committees are charged with bearing these in mind as they do their planning. So, for example, renewed attention to improving bus services is back on the agenda in order to get people out of cars. Similarly, road planning must give greater attention to cycleways and pedestrian safety.

I honestly cannot foresee what will be happening in these aspects of our collective life in 2020 and onwards. The one thing I do feel sure about is that we will no longer be able to expect what we have been used to for many years. The ingenuity and resilience of local communities, greater personal action at the local level and, I fear, greater financial demands will be in the forefront of our thinking.

He visited Simon Peter's home, whose mother-in law he healed there; he went for a meal with Zaccheus whose life was transformed for the better by his visit; Martha and Mary made him welcome regularly, as did many others. However, the person who did most to accommodate and welcome Jesus was his mother Mary who gave him a home in her body until the time came for him to be born, then nurtured and supported him until the end of his days. Mary and Joseph's desperate search for shelter in Bethlehem when there was 'no room at the inn' on the night of Jesus' birth is recalled in the 'Posada' tradition from Mexico (the word means 'Inn') which has evolved into the modern practice of 'travelling cribs'. Sets of nativity figures stay at different homes around a town or village each night of December. Perhaps you have already offered hospitality to a crib from Buckden's own St. Mary's congregation this year? There's still time if you would like to. Christmas is a wonderful time to think about inviting and welcoming Jesus in your home and heart for always. It's truly life-changing.

...Beaufort Drive was named after Margaret Beaufort (1443-1509), mother of Henry VII and founder of Christ's and St. John's colleges, Cambridge. She visited Buckden.


...Bishops Way was named after the bishops of Lincoln, who were housed at Buckden Towers from the 12<sup>th</sup> century until 1841.





## Winter Solstice



This year the winter solstice, or midwinter, is on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> December. This is the shortest day of the year when the sun rises latest and sets earliest. This year the shortest day will last 7 hours and 42 minutes in our area.

After the winter solstice the days do get longer though the coldest winter weather and highest chance of snow is often in January and February.

We tend to refer to the winter solstice as a day but the solstice actually refers to the moment in that day when the sun is at its lowest. The world 'solstice' comes from the Latin solstitium meaning 'sun stands still', because the apparent movement of the Sun's path north or south stops before changing direction. This is very difficult to observe directly but this has been calculated to happen at 4:19 am in the UK this year.

Winter solstice is an important time for cultures across the globe. Under the old Julian calendar, the winter solstice occurred on 25<sup>th</sup> December. With the introduction of the Gregorian calendar the solstice slipped to around the 21<sup>st</sup>, but the Christian celebration of Jesus's birth continued to be held on 25<sup>th</sup> December.

The Feast of Juul (Yule) was a pre-Christian festival observed in Scandinavia at the time of the winter solstice. Fires would be lit to symbolise the heat and light of the returning sun and a log was gathered and burnt in the hearth as a tribute the Norse god Thor. Present day Christmas customs and traditions such as the Yule log stem from the pagan Juul.

While both the winter and summer solstices are celebrated by modern day religions, the ancient civilisation that first built Stonehenge most likely did so primarily for the winter solstice, perhaps to request a good growing season in the year to come. The main features of the Stonehenge site date from the centuries around 3500 BC.


