Buckden Parish Council News...

Buckden Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council is grateful for the support that it has received from residents completing the questionnaire. Nearly 500 completed responses were received. This response is statistically far higher than would normally be expected for a village of our size.

It will take some time to analyse the results fully and a complete report will be given at the Parish Assembly on 23rd April. Rather than wait until then the Council believes that residents will find the following responses received from the majority of responders of particular interest:

- Residents want Buckden to remain a village and feel threatened by the impact of any proposed rapid expansion of housing.
- Survey participants 'Strongly Agreed' that no new housing planning applications should be considered favourably until the impact of the completed Lucks Lane development on traffic and village facilities has been analysed.
- A large majority of responders were strongly in favour
 of supporting the designation of the Great Ouse Valley
 as an 'Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty' and that
 the area around Buckden should be preserved as an
 area of open natural countryside.
- The majority of respondents did not want: any increase in traffic through the village or oversubscribed medical and care facilities and wanted solutions to the current problems experienced at the A1 roundabout and the Main Line level crossing.

Planning

The Council continues to recommend refusal of the final plans for the Lucks Lane development until there are satisfactory solutions to the road safety problems at the A1/Stirtloe Lane junction, noise and pollution and attenuation basins. The Council is meeting representatives from Highways England and HDC to discuss matters further.

The Council is currently considering its response the Silver Street application and this will be debated at the next full Council meeting on Tuesday 12th February. It has arranged for the response period to be extended until 14th February.

Hinchingbrooke School Admission Policy

The Council has written a letter expressing its concerns about the admissions policy being considered by the Aces Academies Trust. In it the Council highlights the possible difficulties which might be faced by parents and pupils living in Buckden.

New Parish Councillors

The Council has been grateful to the local residents who offered themselves for co-option onto the Council.



The following new Councillors have been co-opted in the last two months: Cllrs Orrin James and John Thelwall.

Full details will appear on Parish notice boards.

FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

The current uncertainty surrounding national politics extends down to the local level as well. The next few weeks are challenging times for County Councillors as we grapple with the task of drafting the budget for the coming year. The removal of the central government grant to Cambridgeshire and the cap on the amount by which councils can increase their tax level are two factors which make our decisions even more difficult.

Writing to the chancellor, James Brokenshire, Minister of Housing, Communities and Local Government, said his Ministry does not have enough money to prepare for Brexit and warned that the failure to provide more funding would lead to a "significant risk of disruption". He wrote: "If councils are not given the funding they need now to prepare, we are at increased risk of disruption in the medium to longer term. As you know, government needs local authorities to remain resilient in the face of their other challenges, including pressures in adult social care and children's services."

Mr. Brokenshire also said that a no-deal Brexit could put increased pressure on local councils as they face a an 'influx' of elderly ex-pats. "We require confirmation that this process would cover any costs associated with a large influx of vulnerable UK nationals returning from Europe," he added. "

And in case you think I am being 'party political', I should point out that Mr. Brokenshire is a Conservative!

On more local matters, I have been working with District Councillor Hamish Masson to try to meet the Highways England officers responsible for safety and traffic management. It has not yet been possible to get them to come to a meeting, let alone find a solution.

Housing proposals are uppermost in the minds of Buckden residents at the moment and I share your concerns. Our dilemma is that we know that there is an urgent need for more housing as the national (and local) homelessness problem is just one of the many crises we face. At the same time, we want to protect landscape and heritage. Several residents have been asking me what I can 'do about it'. Decisions on planning are made by Huntingdonshire District Council. The County Council, like the Parish Council, is a consultee. The CCC input is mainly on traffic and safety implications and I have to agree with those who claim that CCC have not been sufficiently forthright in pointing out the traffic dangers and pressures.

We are simultaneously fighting several battles in relation to the roads. We have been hoping to get a safer crossing installed on Buckden Road at the edge of Brampton so that Buckden cyclists and pedestrians can get safely across a busy road where vehicles can travel up to 60 mph. Further along towards Huntingdon, I am putting pressure on the A14 designers to come up with a local road layout that will not make the traffic jams worse than they already are.

If you wish to raise any local matters with me personally and would welcome a face-to-face conversation, I come to the Aragon Room in the Village Hall at 7 pm on the evening of the parish council meeting, the 2nd Tuesday in the month. FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Events have moved on since January, and the government has finally issued guidance and budget proposals for County and District Councils. As expected, the Government is proposing to cut the District Council's allocation by £600,000, which would present your District Council with some difficult decisions on funding allocations. The Government's proposed allocation is still under review, however, and final decisions on District Council funding allocations will be made early in the year.

All these issues were debated and explained at the last HDC meeting on 19 December, which was followed by a presentation by the Chief Constable, Nick Dean. An additional 50 police officers were recruited last year, and, subject to funding, there are plans to add an additional 55 officers. The Police Commissioner, Jason Ablewhite, sought residents' views in a survey which was due to close on 28th January. There may still be time to give your views on police funding via the survey link: https://www.surveymonkey.co.uk/r/RHJL6KW.

This proposed increase will make a big difference to Cambridgeshire policing and give more resilience to Buckden and our neighbouring wards. As well as increasing the number of police on the beat, there are plans to work more closely with District and Parish Councils as well as with the local population by integrating police facilities more closely with local Neighbourhood Watch, Facebook and mental health support groups.

Technology will have a large role to play, with CCTV being used in conjunction with facial recognition software, as well as improved links to regional and national databases. Eventually, it is possible that local parishes could band together to hire their own security personnel to help police local issues like rogue parking or fly-tipping.

A Butterfly's Eye View of Conservation

Our speaker will be Dr. Ed Turner, who holds several academic posts at the University of Cambridge. Although recollections of Remembrance Sunday may have faded a little by the time this is published, I remember a packed church with participation from so many organisations and individuals, and a larger than usual crowd round the War Memorial for the final commemoration. My thanks go to everyone who helped with the organisation and to everyone who attended, but I would like to offer personal thanks to a number of groups and individuals.

Firstly, to everyone from St. Mary's Church for a most moving remembrance service and particularly to Hugh McCurdy, Archdeacon of Huntingdon and Wisbech for his thought-provoking sermon. To all the uniformed organisations, who turned out in numbers and greatly enhanced the ceremony. Particular thanks to Jessica Legge from Buckden School, who read "In Flanders Fields" so well and clearly; not an easy poem. From the Scouts, those who read short memorials for some of those named on our village War Memorial; Will Petty, Ruby Lorigan and Adele Burbidge; Lucy Mayes who read the lesson extremely well and Jack Screaton who stood with me to give the dedication before the two minutes silence.

I must thank Sergeant Dan Nash from Brampton ATC for serving as our standard bearer this year and Brampton ATC for releasing him from other Remembrance Sunday duties to do so. Last, but very far from least, I must thank our faithful trumpeter, Michelle Wootton. She has now performed this service for us for a number of years and having the Last Post and Reveille played live at the War Memorial makes all the difference to that part of the ceremony.

On to other Branch news. After many years doubling up as branch secretary and Poppy Appeal co-ordinator, Veronica Hunstone is resigning as Poppy Appeal co-ordinator, but remaining, at least for the time being, as secretary. I am tremendously grateful to Veronica for devoted service to the Appeal and as secretary over many years and I am pleased to say that she leaves the job on a high; we do not yet have final figures for the Appeal this year, but the amount raised (including the proceeds from the performance of The Armed Man on Saturday 10th November) will be between £5,000 and £6,000; certainly a record for the Branch. I am very pleased to be able to announce that Tim and Celia Walker have kindly agreed to take over as joint Poppy Appeal co-ordinators for 2019.

Buckden Branch is still limping on, but Remembrance goes on regardless. It is, I trust, a sobering thought that on Remembrance Sunday next year we will be remembering the 80th anniversary of the start on the Second World War. Death, injury and destruction were caused on a scale before which that of the Great War, however appalling, pales into insignificance. The Legion still assists many survivors from that war and all the wars and military operations since. We still need members to keep the flame of remembrance alive and to continue to fund the excellent work done by the Legion.



...The vicar of Buckden, Simon, admitted on 17th July 1337 that he owed London hosier, Robert, son of William de Taverner, £24 10s. 0d.

10 | Pipe's Shop, Buckden (1945-96)



Sylvia and Sidney married in 1940 and lived in rented rooms in Cambridge. Sid had failed his medical for the forces but due to his flourishing abilities with radio was seconded to P.Y.E of

Cambridge for the duration of the war, playing his part in the development of radar. Sylvia worked in the P.Y.E. factory, alongside other women, assembling radio communication equipment especially for tanks. She found the factory work an eye-opener and was more than a little shocked by what some of her fellow workers were prepared to offer American soldiers, in exchange for a pair of stockings!

With peacetime came new possibilities. Sid's involvement with P.Y.E. conferred eligibility to develop an electrical franchise. The couple were looking for prospective premises when they visited Buckden in 1945. They saw potential in the striking building at 49 Church Street and duly took on the lease, envisioning their new general and electrical store.

The arrival of 'The Pipes' was a breath of fresh air for the village. The shop was soon smartened up and Sid became the go-to person for technical advice; supplying ready-charged accumulators; shotgun cartridges for pigeon-scaring and a large range of handy tools and fixings. Sid was energetic and determined to build up the electrical side of the business.

With rationing still very much a part of daily life, most Buckden residents were registered with 'Milner's' or 'Bowtells'. These two stores enjoyed the lion's share of local trade. It was evident Sylvia needed to direct some energy to the grocery side of the business in order to attract custom away from these long-established competitors. Fortunately, behind the scene Sylvia had the help and back-room support of her parents (Mr & Mrs Gill) who lived on the premises, too.

Sylvia had a quiet, lady-like countenance and a natural aptitude for customer service, long before training in such matters was considered. She always smiled and treated all her customers the same, whether they were regulars or not, and never neglected to enquire as to the health of other family members. She also produced fabulous home-cooked ham.

The customer base expanded so Sid's best man, Gerald Finch, was offered employment. The long-awaited blessing of parenthood followed, with the arrival of Colin in 1956. With behind the scenes help from the Gills, and Gerald manning the grocery counter and undertaking deliveries to neighbouring villages, life settled into a happy routine and the business prospered.

TV ownership expanded speedily. Sid found himself supplying, installing and repairing TVs and erecting TV aerials. He was also called upon to fix some of the new electrical domestic appliances that were beginning to find their way into village homes; toasters, vacuum cleaners, fridges and washing machines. Sid could fix them all!



Over the road the Hinsby's were beginning to find their corner shop 'too much' in their declining years. Sid duly took on the lease in 1962, employing local girls, first 'Chrissie' Gale and after she left to get married, Jane Milner. Following the death of Mr Hinsby in 1973, the Pipes were able to purchase the freehold for their shop. They also acquired the remaining stock from the corner shop and Jane moved over the road too. Colin joined the business after leaving school. He in-

troduced a new element to the shop with bedding plants and garden supplies. Colin had green fingers and his handiwork further expanded the shop's market range.

The shop window displays were renowned locally - an attractive focal point - especially at Christmas. Gifts of all descriptions were amassed for the window-shopper to stop and wonder at. Christmas trees also adorned the shop front, where the bedding plants were displayed during the summer. With the signature row of coloured lights above, this sight simply couldn't fail to raise one's spirits.

Mrs Pipe continued to supply her home-cooked ham, popular throughout the village. The home produce section expanded with Kath Milner's home-baked Cornish pasties, sausage rolls, and, in season, Christmas cakes, mince pies and marmalade. Although the shop was open daily from 8.30 to 6pm, closing only for lunch hour and on Sunday afternoons, such was the conviviality and patience of the Pipes that they found themselves at the mercy of out-of-hours customers knocking on their back door - even on Christmas Day!

The family bungalow in Church Street, started in 1970, was finally completed and ready for occupation in 1980. There were some benefits to be gained from living away from the shop. Sadly, it wasn't long after that Sid's health began to decline. The electrical side of the business closed in 1981 and Sid died in 1984.

The shop continued to prosper and an off-licence was obtained. Plans were drawn up to expand the shop floor and modernise the premises. The work was completed in December 1985. Sylvia did not embrace the new automated till with unalloyed enthusiasm. When it came to totalling the bill she'd had years of practice with a scrap of paper and a biro. She avoided new protocol where possible, sharing a surreptitious and knowing smile with customers and whispering 'Don't tell Colin'!

With the closure of Milner's shop in 1986, more loyal customers stepped over the threshold. Business was thriving and felt secure, but not for very long. The big supermarkets in surrounding towns were beginning to have an impact. More villagers were choosing to shop at Tesco, only using the local stores for convenience items. By the mid 1990's the shop lacked sufficient custom to sustain it. Having thrived for 50 years its doors closed for the final time in February 1996.

(Sylvia and Colin left the village for retirement in Essex. Sylvia passed away in December 2017 aged 95. Long term residents of the village turned out in huge numbers to pay their respects and share fond memories at her funeral on 14th February 2018).

Did you know...?

...In 1439, Buckden housewife, Alice Govy, was accused of stealing two kerchiefs and three skeins of yarn, worth two shillings, from John Falconer and John Attwood who were both inhabitants of Buckden. At her trial the jury found her guilty and she would probably have been put to death – had it not been discovered she was pregnant. She petitioned Henry VI for mercy, claiming her sufferings were undeserved and due solely to "the envy and malice of enemies". Her plea was successful and on 15th December 1439 she received a royal pardon.



Buckden Bites

Did you know...?

...The oldest relic of human activity found in Buckden is a flint axe from the early Stone Age period. Roman pottery remains have also been found and there is evidence of a small Roman settlement from the second century AD.

...The name "Buckden" comes from "Bugce" and "dene". "Bucge" is the name of a person and is a feminine name. "Dene" means valley. "Buckden" therefore came from "Bucge's valley".

...Buckden was first recorded in the Domesday Book in 1066 and seems to be a quite ordinary medieval village. The lord of the manor had 37 'serfs', of whom 20 held plots of land for farming. There was a church, a mill and a large meadow. It was valued at £16 10s.

...Buckden church dates from around 1200. The tower and nave are 15th century.

Did you know...?

...Buckden has been on a major artery from early times. The Great North Road (now A1) was maintained as an important highway throughout the middle ages and was improved by Edward I (1272–1307) who needed it for moving his armies.

...Buckden butcher, William Mariot was convicted of theft after he stole a mare from its owner at Sibthorpe. To evade capture he fled to Offord church hoping to claim sanctuary but did not succeed and was forced to admit his theft, worth 10 shillings, before the coroner. He was pardoned after two years on 23rd May 1408.


Managers Representative




