Buckden Parish Council News...

Neighbourhood Plan

Those of you who attended the Parish Assembly will have heard the progress that has been made on the plan. It reflects the views given by residents in the questionnaire completed last year. The presentation at the Assembly was the first stage of the consultation which is necessary to have the plan adopted. Hard copies will be available in the library and the Council office from the middle of May and it will also be available on the Council's website. Residents are urged to read it and to submit their comments in writing to the Clerk as soon as possible. When these are received the Plan will be amended to reflect any important suggested changes and then passed to HDC for its comments. After it has been agreed with them it will be submitted to an independent Inspector. If the plan is approved by the inspector the final stage of the consultation will be a referendum when all residents will have their last opportunity to vote for the plan. The final stage will be when the plan is endorsed by the full District Council. It is a long but very worthwhile journey.


Parish Council Photo Competition

As announced last month the Parish Council Photo Competition will again take place with all entries displayed during the summer festival weekend. We are now calling all photographers. Parish Precept

The Council has received some questions about the apparently large increase in the Parish Precept for the year 2019-2020. Although 22.7% appears high it equates to approximately 30p per week for a band D house, which is less than the cost of a cup of coffee a month. The increase is due to several factors. Firstly we have not increased the precept by enough in previous years and have, as a consequence, allowed our reserves to run low; secondly we have had several major projects this



en into account the possible extra costs involved if the County and District Councils reduce the services that they provide. We did announce the increase in the December edition of the Roundabout.

Planning and Roads

Residents will have seen the changes made to the Stirtloe Lane/A1 road junction. The Council has made a formal complaint about the adequacy of this junction. We strongly believe that there should be deceleration and acceleration lanes in order to ensure the safety of drivers on both roads. Our complaint has been rejected by Highways England but we are not going to stop in our efforts.

Resignation of Councillors

The Council has accepted the resignation of two long standing Councillors, Fiona Shirley and John Moore. John has been a stalwart of our ROW and Road Safety Advisory Groups, Fiona has been chairman of the Council for seven years of her fifteen years on the Council. Both will be greatly missed.

Parish Council Vacancies

The resignations mean that there are two vacancies on the Council. If you are interested in becoming a Councillor and helping to shape the future of the village please contact either the Chairman or the Clerk.

Office Opening Hours The Office opening hours are: Mon, Weds and Thursday 10.30 -2.00pm, Tuesday 2-4 pm, Fri – closed.

Council Meetings

The next meeting of the Council will be held at 7.30pm on Tuesday 14th May. The meeting will include a 15 minute open forum. Residents are asked to apply in writing to the Parish Clerk by 8th May, outlining what they wish to say, for a three minute slot.

If required the Council Planning Committee will meet on Tuesday 30th April and Tuesday 14th May at 7.00pm. Agendas for these meetings are posted on the Parish notice boards not later than the Saturday preceding the meeting.

FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

I was pleased to attend the Annual Assembly on April 23rd where I presented a full report on the last year in the County Council. Below is a very abridged version. The key issue for the County Council: reduced funding and increased demand

Central government has reduced its annual revenue grant to local authorities; locally that is from £86 million in 2013-14 to nil for the coming year 2019-20. Councils have little flexibility to increase tax levels and Cambridgeshire turned down that option in previous years but not this year (see below).

Over 60% of County Council expenditure goes on services to older people and to young children. The demand for services is increasing as the elderly population and the under-fives increase and services are costing more.

Child protection is a major responsibility, including taking children at serious risk into care. There are currently over 700 in this situation. This an important and expensive activity – failure to identify and support families in need at an early stage results in greater suffering later and increased costs for the public purse.

Council Tax

For several years the government has capped the levels by which local councils can increase tax. Until last year, Cambridgeshire CC decided to implement the 2% social care increase but decided on no increase in the basic council tax. However, for the coming year 2019-20, the Council has voted for the 2% increase for adult social care plus 2.99% which can

be used for other services. The cost to a Band D household of every 1% increase is 23p per week. The 4.99% increase will cost £1.15 per week. Over 60% of households in Cambridgeshire are in the lower bands A-C.

The Council's Chief Finance Officer has informed councillors that the savings needed over the next five years amount to £69 million (in a gross budget of £573 million).

Services for older people

More and more people are living longer and, in the main, healthier lives. When they do become dependent, the cost to the Council is very considerable. The Council's aim is to enable more people to live longer at home and be supported there, rather than going into sheltered accommodation.

The policy of 'Transformation' is based on a significant reduction in personnel together with higher expectations on the voluntary sector and an assumption of a willingness on the part of beneficiaries to accept new ways of being supported.

Buckden specifically

I attend monthly Parish Council meetings where I present a written report on current issues and listen to the reaction of the Parish Council. I liaise with the Parish Clerk and Chairman between meetings as required. In many respects, Buckden is a privileged village. It has a vibrant and varied social and cultural life, good facilities for recreation and many committed and hard-working people devoted to the good of others in the village. It has a good range of local shops and amenities, and pubs! Nevertheless ...

Most of my local work on a day-to-day basis is in responding to requests for information from residents, dealing as far as possible with their complaints. The complaints have become more numerous and more strident over the last two years. I

FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Work on the A1 is going forward very quickly and I attended the opening ceremony for the return to national speed limits in Buckden area. No ribbons were cut but there was a tour of the ongoing work and the new Ouse Bridge, both below and on top of it. Until you see the scale of these structures at close quarters, you just do not appreciate the amount of work and the skill of all the workers involved. Congratulations to all of the various teams involved for a really fantastic effort on this project. The bridge has a design life of 130 years, so we will all have time to get used to this!

A new and welcome development is that the A1 work will be given Motorway status, and as a result a new strategic study for the A1 Baldock/Alconbury link has been started. It is too early to have any interim results, but it does mean that the issue of the Roundabout is now on the agenda at Highways England. The team at HE are convinced that once the Ouse Bridge is complete there will be an improvement at Buckden, as they believe a very large number of trucks will be diverted away from us.

I have attended a number of local and national conferences on traffic strategy and the impact of the local development going on around us. While we all know about the local developments like St Neots Wintersham Park, and Alconbury Weald, we may be less aware of Wing, Northstow, Trumpington Meadows, Waterbeach New Town and the impact of the proposed East/West Rail Link.

It is very important that the new rail links include St Neots, as this would give a huge boost to the local economy and jobs. A lot of lobbying is still needed, so if you get a chance to give your opinion, please support this option. The sheer scale of all this local development will bring more challenges, and I am working hard to identify the important issues for Buckden and to make sure we are as prepared as we can be. More news on all of this anon!

Buckden Neighbourhood Watch

Visible policing would prevent anti-social behaviour or burglaries, but policing is changing. In a recent police survey, 61 % said they were prepared to pay an extra £2 a month for policing. This would generate an extra £7.6 million in funding.

The extra money would be used to recruit 50 new officers, and whilst Cambridgeshire is a safe county, police have to spend more time tackling 'hidden crimes' such as domestic abuse, child sexual exploitation, and modern day slavery. The police also have to spend time helping those in a mental health crisis

The county population is set to rise by 20 per cent by 2031, and there is need to have enough resources to police our county.

The Purpose of Neighbourhood Watch The purpose is to provide information on the latest scams, to give advice about staying safe and secure and to repeat the phone numbers and email addresses of the police.

In the past, I felt vulnerable about my property, about burglary and damage to my belongings. Now I feel vulnerable when answering the telephone, or using computers. For example, it

is common these days to receive a telephone message informing me that I shall be arrested if I do not respond by ringing a telephone number which is purporting to be the police or a debt collector, but is in fact a scam.

Similarly, I often get calls claiming that my broadband or computer has a problem, which can be sorted out for a fee and a demand to supply our account details. It is, of course, a scam.

Each day I receive emails supposedly from HMRC or businesses telling me that I have an outstanding bill to pay, and if I fail to pay the bill, there will be county court judgement against me. These are scams.

So our concerns have shifted from physical issues to those surrounding scams, phishing and other on-line and telephone fraud.

Safe to say we are over the seven year itch several times over. What a disaster that so many couples no longer seem to go the distance of their wedding vows. They say nothing lasts for ever!

I would disagree, for we read in scripture that 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever'. (Hebrews 13: 8). I actually based my sermon on this verse the last time I preached at our Church. We find that in this ever-changing world, one thing is constant in that neither God, Jesus Christ or the Holy Spirit change. In fact we also used H.F. Lytes' hymn with the words 'Change and decay in all around I see; O Thou who changest not abide with me'. It is something that I feel we all should know.

A professor of philosophy at London University, C.E.M. Joad, was not a Christian. When asked on a radio programme, "If you could meet any person from the past and ask them just one question, whom would you meet and what question would you ask?" Professor Joad answered without hesitation: "I would meet Jesus Christ and ask him the most important

question in the world – 'Did you or did you not rise from the dead?'".

There came a day in Professor Joad's life when he assessed the evidence, encountered Jesus himself and wrote a book called, Recovery of Belief. If Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, this changes everything.

When the New Testament writers speak of God's love they point to the cross. When they speak of God's power they point to the resurrection. God's 'incomparably great power' was 'exerted in Christ when he raised him from the dead' (Ephesians 1:19–20). The risen Jesus says to his disciples, 'All authority (all power to rule) in heaven and on earth has been given to me' (Matthew 28:18, AMP).

The resurrection means that the risen Jesus is present with you now. Jesus continues, 'I am with you always' (v.20).

The result of the resurrection is not only his power and his presence but also his provision.

So, nothing changes as Jesus is with us always! I pray that we all may know this truth!

Molly's on the move!

28 year old Molly has lived in Buckden all her life and is an active member of the community when her health allows – volunteering at the school and library, babysitting and attending social groups.

Molly is very grateful to all at The Vine, St. Mary's Church, Buckfest and community members who helped her raise money for her £16,000 Q700m motorised wheel chair, aka Frieda. This is a single handed, self-drive wheelchair which Molly drives using a joystick on a pad which can be rotated for a companion to use if needed as she has intermittent paralysis, often triggered by fatigue.

The wheelchair is battery powered with a 15-20 miles range. It has 6 wheels, with mid wheel drive to minimise the turning



circle. It is very stable although it has taken some getting used to. The chair has preset positions but will move from upright seated (for bus use, occupying the least space) to fully reclining. The seat will also move up so that Molly is positioned at her own standing height, making conversation with standing people easier. She can choose heights in between to talk to shopkeepers or to reach high shelves.

Frieda is very heavy so ramps at the front door and a special vehicle to transport Frieda and Molly are essential.

Frieda has changed Molly's life. She is able to move around the rooms at home and eat meals with her family instead of being confined to an upstairs bedroom. Molly is able to go out alone to socialise, even on dark afternoons as the chair has headlights, rear lights and indicators.

As well as being able to go out in Buckden, Molly can also go further afield. Molly has been shopping independently to Huntingdon on the bus and has also been to St Neots, Brampton, St Ives and Rushden Lakes Shopping Centre which, being a new build, is easy for her to access. The Madingley Park and Ride buses, with their drop down ramps, mean that Molly can get into Cambridge.

Molly's biggest expedition so far has been to London to see Joanna Lumley's one woman show, where she and her mum met Dawn French and Jennifer Saunders. Staff at St. Neots station and the theatre were very helpful and they had a great time

Molly says her eyes are bigger than her energy levels but the fully reclining position on her wheelchair means that she can rest on the way back from a day out.

In addition to gaining her wheelchair, the family home has been adapted with the aid of a Home Improvement Agency grant. This has provided Molly with a suitable room and bathroom of her own, with doors to the back and front of the house. Her plans for the next year include the installation of permanent ramps to the back garden and at the front door, with a front door system so she can let herself in and out as well as letting her own visitors in.

Molly's planning more expeditions, making the most of her improved health, with a trip to MK Theatre to see Les Miserables and Pink at Wembley. A trip to Disneyland Paris will be her birthday treat and, as her last holiday was in 2009, she's really looking forward to it.

attribute this to the divisive effect of the Brexit issue.

The majority of grumbles relate to roads – congestion, potholes, road works, traffic controls, misleading road signs, worn-out markings, road capacity where there are new housing developments, inadequate cycle paths. The A1 roundabout, the Offords rail crossing, Stirtloe Road are regularly mentioned,

Combined Authority

The introduction of a Combined Authority makes it unnecessary to have both County and District Councils as well and perhaps one of the layers of local government could be pruned to save costs. A motion to CCC calling for this idea to be investigated was remitted to the Mayor and has been ignored.

The future for local government services and the implication for communities

We are approaching a cliff edge in relation to local government. There is simply not enough money in the system to enable the Council to provide the services that people have come to expect. Perhaps we have allowed a 'dependency' culture to develop. Changing that culture is a major challenge, not only in Cambridgeshire but more widely. The expectation appears to be that services will be 'transformed' and local groups - parish councils, voluntary groups - will provide greater day-to-day support for those in the greatest need.

Madge Watt was the Canadian woman who brought the WI to the UK. She was a founder member of the first WI in British Columbia. In 1913 after the death of her husband Dr Alfred Watt, Madge brought her two sons to England to complete their education. She was keen to start WIs in Britain, but it was not until 1915, when she met John Nugent Harris, secretary of the Agricultural Organisations Society (AOS), that she had any success. The AOS then employed her,

The first WI meeting in the UK was held in Llanfairpwll on Anglesey, Wales, on 16 September 1915. The W.I. was first established to educate rural women, and to encourage countrywomen to get involved in growing and preserving food to help to increase the supply of food to the war-torn nation. Madge formed well over 300 WIs including one at Sandringham following an invitation from Queen Mary. Even today our present Queen attends the WI at Sandringham when she is staying there.

When the NFWI was formed in 1917, Lady Denman was elected the first National Chairman. Denman College was named

after Lady Denman and is the WI's centre for learning, offering a wealth of opportunities to learn new skills on day schools and residential courses in the field of cookery, craft and lifestyle.

The first Buckden WI President was Miss Lynton and the motto was "The only way to have a friend is be one". The members felt this motto still applies today.

It was an inspiring talk Jackie gave us and it made us really think what a big organisation we belong to and how our resolutions have made an impact, such as looking after the environment, health issues, fair trade, equality for both men and women and social issues.

Welcome to the world of wildlife in Huntingdonshire!

Are you interested in finding out more about the wildlife around Huntingdon and Peterborough? Perhaps you are already sending records to one or more of the online sites such as iRecord or posting plant and animal photographs via a Facebook account or Twitter page. If so, why not join the Huntingdonshire Fauna & Flora Society?

Founded in 1948 the objective of the Society is to promote the study, conservation and recording of wildlife throughout Hun-

tingdonshire and Peterborough.

Membership is open to all with an interest in the wildlife living in our local area. In the summer months specialists in groups of species, which include flowering plants, mammals, fungi, insects and all kinds of other invertebrates, visit specific sites. They are joined by enthusiastic ama-

teurs, some with extensive knowledge and others just starting. In 2019 we intend to visit sites as far apart as Portholme Meadow (Brampton) and Therfield Heath (near Royston). Although we set out to record wildlife the meetings are informal and give an opportunity to learn and contribute to our better understanding of the value of our countryside. Ultimately this contributes to the conservation of our environment.

In the winter months we meet in the Hinchingbrooke Countryside Centre where illustrated talks on natural history provide

additional information. These are open meetings. Subjects in 2018/19 range from European butterflies, Paxton Pits Nature Reserve and Phenology, the study of seasonal rhythms in plant and animal life cycles. There is a small charge for non-members.

Publication of the results of research and survey

form an important part of our contribution to the conservation of species and sites. Books describing the distribution of plants throughout our area and the wildlife of Brampton Wood are amongst the more recent. Huntingdonshire Grasslands were the subject of a volume to commemorate the Society's 60th birthday.



The children had a lovely end to the spring term, meeting Pebbles, Betsy and Bluebell the lambs (thank you to Polly O'Driscoll for bringing them for a visit), and they went home clutching the beans they had been growing at Preschool. We hope they've continued to thrive at home!

Our Easter Egg Design competition was a great success. Congratulations to the 0-2 category winner Jaiden Asplin, 3-4 winner Thomas Pearce and 5-6 winner, Bethany Knibbs, who impressed the judges with their colourful and beautiful designs. Our Easter Rock Hunt is in progress as I write: the Easter Bunny helped us hide special Easter-themed painted rocks around Buckden, each with a unique code, for children to find over the holidays. Entrants will write down the codes on entry forms (kindly held for us by Nisa and Days – thanks once again to them for all they do to support us). Five finds means an entry in the prize draw! We will have details of winners next month, but thank you to everyone who took part in both fundraisers.

Also, a big thank you to those who donate change to our collection box at Nisa (which contained nearly £20 last time we emptied it!) or chose us as recipients of their blue Tesco tokens. The Tesco donation has been used to buy new furniture. We've also been chosen as a local cause by the Co-op stores in Brampton and Little Paxton. This is a year-long support initiative that's already raised £115 for us—you can help by getting a Co-op membership card and swiping it every time you shop.

During the first half of our summer term, we will be looking at People Who Help Us, our leavers will be practising getting changed for PE and the other skills they will need in school, and our committee will be looking out for new members as some move on to support their child's primary school. 




